


I catch the sweet, though far-off hymn that hails a new cre - a - tion.

**BENEDICTION:**

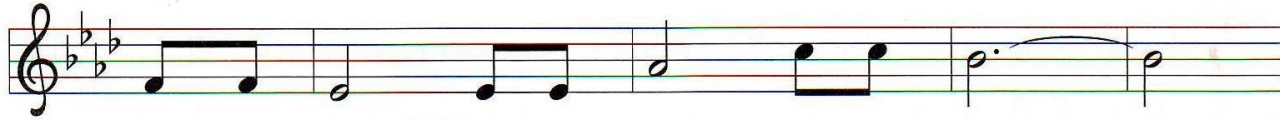

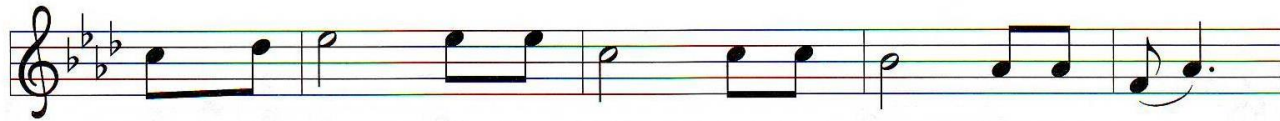
## SENDING HYMN: “Precious Lord, Take My Hand”



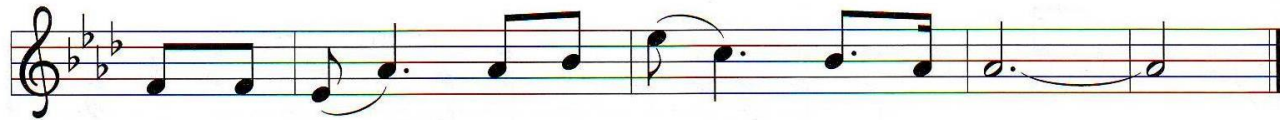
